



Importing Personal Property into Lithuania

Required Documents:

- Copy of passport and valid visa
- Power of attorney letter
- Performa invoice
- Airway Bill/Bill of lading
- Inventory
- CMR

Note:

Shipper should be present at time of customs clearance, and should be employed with a registered company. Only a limited amount of foodstuff, new items and electronics are allowed duty free.

Temporary import of household goods and personal effects is duty and tax-free for one year. This can be renewed until the shipper has completed his or her stay and is ready to export the shipment. Permanent import of HHG's and personal effects is subject to duties and taxes. A V.A.T. of 20% will be charged on the import.

Importing Motor Vehicles

It is extremely difficult for non-Lithuanian shippers to import a car into Lithuania. Contact your customer service representative for more information.

Prohibited Items

- Firearms
 - Ammunition
 - Live animals
 - Pornographic materials
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Restricted Items

The following goods are restricted to the listed amounts. Please contact your customer service representative for the latest restrictions.

- Alcohol (1 Liter), Wine (3L), Beer (5L)
- Tobacco (200 cigarettes or 250g of tobacco)
- Sugar (1 kg)
- Chocolate (3 kg)
- Coffee (2 kg)
- Jewelry (50 kg)
- Gas (20 L)
- Car (1 car)
